Survey Details

- Research with 503 Saudi Citizens in Saudi Arabia 02.04.20 to 05.04.20
- Research conducted online, questions designed by APCO Worldwide, fielded by Censuswide
- Sample is broadly representative of wider demographics
- Margin of Error: +/- 4 points



Economy: Spending has held up well, some caution anticipated on 'Bounceback'

■Puchasing will take a long time to return to normal


■Wait, then return to normal

Balance of Opinion – Agree vs Disagree*




^{*}Clear space: those who neither agree nor disagree, or have no opinion



"We should take the Coronavirus crisis as a warning to slow down the growth of large cities in future"



% Concerned about long-term negative impacts of restrictions on... (if all impacted equally)




Q5. If all of the following events were to be negatively impacted in the long-term due to the current restrictions, which of the following would you be most concerned about?


